Introduction Church Chat Video (30 min.) Why do we even have an enemy? What does he have against us? God will use the family as the vehicle for the enemy's undoing. (Gen 3) Rev. 12: "that ancient serpent" Satan hates the family because it is God's and it showcases His image and love. Is this going too far or right on? "The enemy of the family is the enemy of God." Go high, go low. Satan wants to make humanity as either unto themselves or as with no self-control or special capacity. But we bear God's image! The devil is not omnipresent, so who's on his team? Who's to blame? Worldviews and the reshaping of minds Why do we consume so much and still feel hungry? "The world is the enemy least difficult to conquer, the devil is the hardest to understand, but the flesh is the most tenacious." It's too easy to blame. The problem is not just out there! It's . . Deon on Skid Row: "This is where I work. This is where God called me to be. I believe that with my whole heart....I try to look at people the way God looks at people... I want to show I love them and I want to help make their lives better....Some have problems, severe problem, but they're people....Get to know the people....People will see you for who you are, not what you are.
